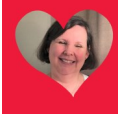

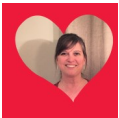

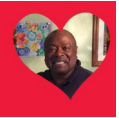

Affordable Housing

Since 2001, gross rent has increased 3 percent a year, on average, while income has declined by an average of 0.1 percent annually (according to The Pew Charitable Trust). The beginning monthly rent in Pineville is \$850. Someone working a job that pays minimum wage would have to work 390 hours per month to have a healthy balance of spending 30% of their income on housing.
